

## MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

**FISHING LICENSES:** You must purchase your fishing license prior to your charter flight to camp. Licenses are \$45 for a 7 day non-resident plus \$45 for 7 day king salmon stamp; start license at noon on day 1 of your trip. They can be purchased online at [www.admin.adfg.state.ak.us/license/](http://www.admin.adfg.state.ak.us/license/).

**You DO need a King Salmon stamp for the Outpost camp.**

**CATCH AND RELEASE:** We are a catch and release operation, and we even prefer to not to keep any rainbow trout or grayling because of the incredibly slow growing season in Alaska (a 20" trout in Alaska is 8 years old!). Fresh salmon are fair game for meals at the Outpost camp. If you want to take fish home, you may purchase it from the locals in King Salmon who can provide commercially caught fish. We can help arrange this.

**CLOTHING AND PERSONAL ITEMS:** We have found over the years that cotton and wool clothing do not dry well in the Alaskan weather; therefore we **STRONGLY** recommend that your pullovers, shirts, camp pants, long underwear, etc. are synthetic, synthetic or wool blends, or polar fleece type clothing.

**FITNESS:** This is a physical week requiring 15 to 100+ minute hikes across uneven terrain. There is almost no elevation change, but walking on tundra can be like walking through soft sand or a field of thick, wet sponges. 1 tundra mile equals 2 or 3 pavement miles.

Guests must be in excellent cardiovascular shape to reach the upper stretches (45+ min. hike) of our home river. You should be able to walk 5+ flights of stairs without being winded.

Please do not show up at camp in poor physical condition - it could make a long and possibly unenjoyable week. And please do not count frequent golfing or walking around the block as proper training for this adventure.

**BEAR PEPPER SPRAY:** Generally, the commercial airlines will not allow you to travel with bear pepper spray. Should you arrive King Salmon with it, or purchase some in King Salmon, you must declare possession of it to the charter flight pilots so they can safely secure it for flight!

**FIREARMS:** We do see bears throughout the season, but please do NOT bring personal firearms to camp.

**TIPPING:** For simplicity, we suggest each angler wait until the end of the week and leave \$300 to \$500 TOTAL with the camp manager or owner. This tip pool is divided evenly among all staff. Cash or multiple traveler's checks preferred.

**RECHARGING BATTERIES:** We have a small solar power system capable of charging small, portable electronics but ONLY through either a USB or a 12V DC car (cigarette lighter) connection. We will have the female side of USB and 12V DC (cigarette car adapter). You bring the chord that plugs into your device on one end and either USB or 12V DC on the other end. We CANNOT accommodate 120V AC wall plugs (like in your house).

**SATELLITE PHONE:** If you need a satellite phone for personal use during your visit, please rent one prior to your arrival at camp from Outfitter Satellite. They may be reached at (877) 436-2255. There is a satellite phone available at camp for **EMERGENCY USE ONLY**. If you must talk with work or home, please rent a satellite phone.

During the season, personal and emergency messages from home or work may be relayed to camp through [info@epicaaa.com](mailto:info@epicaaa.com), or as a back up method you may contact Egli Air Haul at 907.246.3554 to relay a message.

**SHOWERS:** Do you want a *real* shower before traveling back home? The King Ko Inn and Antlers Inn, if they have a room available, will usually let you shower for \$15 - \$20/person. The worst-case option is to get a room for the day when you return to Anchorage.

**BUGS:** We strongly suggest that you bring Buzz Off type clothing (outer shirts and pants). A cheaper option is to treat your existing clothes with spray-on permethrin. You can find it at your local sporting goods or outdoor/camping store for around \$20. **DO NOT FORGET YOUR HEADNET!**

**DEPARTING CAMP:** Bring 1 or 2 plastic trash/garbage bags to pack your wet gear and dirty clothes.
